The exhibition *Figuring Motion* presents Terry Rosenberg’s large-scale paintings of the human form in motion, with the emphasis on dance. Rosenberg uses movement as his main concept and form. His unfolding brushstrokes communicate the kinetic power of dance as it occurs. Rosenberg states “I am interested in revealing the qualities of the transient, transparent and ephemeral, which are inherent in all aspects of the human condition and especially identifiable in dance.” His focus has included many leading dance groups such as: American Ballet Theatre, Dance Theatre of Harlem, Mark Morris Dance Group, and Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Dance Company. Mr. Rosenberg lives and works in New York City.
