CLINICIAN BIOGRAPHIES

Gail Berenson

Gail Berenson, Professor of Piano at Ohio University, Athens, is a dedicated teacher, active performer, passionate chamber music collaborator, and noted expert on musician wellness issues. The Immediate Past President of Music Teachers National Association, an association of 24,000 members, she has performed and lectured in over thirty states and six countries. Ms. Berenson is one of the co-authors of *A Symposium for Pianists and*



Teachers: Strategies to Develop Mind and Body for Optimal Performance. In July 2010, she will travel to Beijing, China to present a session, "Strategies for Coping with Performance Anxiety", as part of the International Society of Music Education's newly established Forum on Instrumental and Vocal Studio Performance Teaching.

Christopher Fisher

Dr. Christopher Fisher is Assistant Professor of Piano at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio where he serves as Co-Chair of the Keyboard Division and Coordinator of Group Piano. Dr. Fisher is the author of *Teaching Piano in Groups* (Oxford University Press), a one-stop compendium of information related to all aspects of teaching piano in group environments and the only available resource of its kind. He is an active collaborative



pianist and performs frequently with his wife, Katherine, as a member of the Fisher Piano Duo. An active workshop clinician, Fisher has presented lectures throughout North America and Australia.

GUEST CLINICIAN

Randall Faber

Last year, Randall Faber appeared at the Gilmore Festival, the Wasserman Festival, the Portland International Piano Festival, the Korean Piano Adventures Convention in Seoul, and in a lecture-recital tour of Southeast Asia. While in Korea, Faber appeared on the popular television show Heart-to-Heart, which is broadcast in 188 countries, and his June solo recital in Chicago was broadcast live on WFMT public radio.



In recent seasons, Dr. Faber toured Australia, New Zealand, Taiwan, and the United Kingdom. He was a

Convention Artist for last year's Music Teachers National Association Conference and has been a master teacher for the World Conference on Piano Pedagogy, National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy, and the National Piano Teachers Institute. He gave recent recitals in Seoul, Jakarta, Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Perth, Chicago, Dallas, Austin, Indianapolis, Fort Worth, and Alberta. He has presented as Visiting Artist at universities throughout North America and Asia.

Randall Faber holds three degrees from the University of Michigan and a Ph.D. in Education and Human Development from Vanderbilt University. In 2005, he presented his scholarly research at the 9th International Conference on Motivation in Lisbon, Portugal.

Randall and his wife Nancy are well-known as authors of the best-selling Piano Adventures® teaching method and their many publications for the piano. They recently founded the Faber Piano Institute, which provides music-teacher support services such as PianoAdventures.com.
